- True submission is purposefully and voluntarily done
  - In order to correctly and fully submit, one must do so out of his own free will and desire.
  - A weak willed person forced into submission like a beat dog is not truly submitting.
  - To give up what one has is a much different scenario than "giving up" what one does not possess.
- Christians should follow the governmental rules and not be anarchists attempting to topple the government
  - Even the stupid rules.
